This fee includes up to three visits consisting of Meet & Greets or Lessons/Riding Sessions (depending on ability) with a BRNR trainer at the Rescue.

Please note, each individual rescue horse has a set adoption fee. These fees vary from \$1,000 - \$3,500 and go towards supporting the Rescue's continued operation.
